- 3. Future steps: what kind of revisions and additions are to be done to the paper now? What kind of new research questions does the paper inspire to? Is there a comparative element (to Uganda – Tanzania)? What are possible short- and long-term publication outputs stemming from the paper that can come on our website (e.g. brief, blog, working paper, article...)?*
